On this 4th Sunday of Easter – also known as Good Shepherd Sunday – we join the Church in celebrating the 61st World Day of Prayer for Vocations. We pray that all receive the grace to discern and faithfully live their vocation as disciples of Christ – married, single, ordained, or religious. We ask especially for vocations to our diocesan priesthood, deaconate, the Society of Jesus, Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet and Sister of St. Francis of the Newmann Community.

We pray also for an increase in the recognition of the baptismal equality of women that endows them with the same capacity to be called to ordained ministry: "In Christ, women and men are clothed with the same baptismal dignity and receive equally the variety of gifts of the Spirit," states the interim document from the ongoing Synod on Synodality. "We are called together into a communion of loving, non-competitive relationships in Christ, and to a co-responsibility to be expressed at every level of the Church's life." (9b) Let us all continue to listen to the Spirit speaking through our Synodal journey as we work to create the inclusive and authentic Community that Jesus envisioned. Amen!
