FROM our CARE for OUR COMMON HOME TEAM: In the midst of our climate crisis, Pope Francis reminds us in "Laudate Deum" that we must maintain hope to move forward. In her article, "Three Places Changing Quickly to Fight Climate Change," published in The New York Times, Delger Erdenesanaa tells us that progress, although complicated, is happening.

"In South America, one country has pivoted in less than a decade to generating almost all its electricity from a diverse mix of renewables. In China, an electric car that costs just \$5,000 is suddenly one of the biggest sellers. Paris is transforming itself into a city of bikes."



Globally, "we're not moving as fast as we need to," said Thomas Spencer, an analyst at the International Energy Agency. "But we definitely have the tools to go much faster." "Climate solutions actually do exist. They're here now," said Jonathan Foley, the executive director of Project Drawdown, a nonprofit organization focused on climate action."

So, with that hope in mind, what can we do here at *All Saints*? The Caring for Our Common Home Taskforce has been investigating the possibility of installing solar panels somewhere on our church grounds. In the coming weeks, you'll hear more from the Pope's discussion in "*Laudate Deum*" urging us to take action. You'll get an explanation of what the installation of solar panels involves, and the possible advantages of installing solar panels. Likewise, you'll learn about the some challenges. We hope to present what we are learning, to inform our conversations in the near future.

There is hope. We have the tools now and can act together to combat the crisis threatening God's gift of the earth.
